

## Program Capacity

CATS manages numerous programs targeted to a variety of specific populations. We offer multiple levels of care ranging from outpatient to residential. At present CATS has the capacity to serve:

40 men in the residential Therapeutic Community, which provides three to nine months of residential treatment.

30 men in Residential Treatment Program, which provides treatment from thirty to ninety days.

40 women in Residential Treatment Program, which provides treatment from thirty to ninety days.

For a total of 110 residential beds.

CATS Plus currently has capacity to serve 20 men and 5 women for an additional twelve months post-treatment.

Outpatient can serve up to 90 individuals a day, providing assessments, individual and group counseling, and case management.

In addition to these services, CATS provides treatment for 48 women each year at the Northeast Pre- Release Center for Women.

## History & Mission

Since its inception in 1990, Community Assessment & Treatment Services, Inc. (CATS) has developed into a premier treatment facility, serving primarily adult men and women returning from or involved in the criminal justice system.

**CATS mission** is to provide high quality, cost effective, holistic, abstinent-based intervention and prevention services. These services address the chemical dependency and/or mental health needs of a diverse clientele.

In addition to the treatment, CATS offers ancillary services such as workforce readiness, financial literacy, culture experience through music and art, recreation, and community outreach. CATS is also a community resource to the neighborhood through creative education and prevention strategies.

To date, CATS has served over 30,000 individuals and their families. CATS experiences a 78% success rate, defined as those who enter and complete the assigned level of care.

### ASSESSMENTS

- Comprehensive bio- psycho- social
- Used to determine the existence and/or severity of a substance abuse issue.
- Helps to determine the level of care required in most circumstances.
- Available to self-pay, Medicaid, court referred, or agency referred individuals (i.e. Dept. of Children & Family Services)

### RESIDENTIAL TREATMENT

- Cognitive - behavioral therapy model, supplemented with the 12-step model
- Physical and mental health screenings and treatment referrals as needed
- Available to self-pay or court referred

### CATS PLUS RESIDENTIAL

- Housing, employment, and aftercare for successful program graduates or community referrals

## Services

### NON-INTENSIVE OUTPATIENT

- Includes opportunities for participants to access group counseling, individual counseling, assessments, urinalysis, and case management.
- Used also as an aftercare program for residential and intensive outpatient graduates
- Available to self-pay, court-referred, and Medicaid

### INTENSIVE OUTPATIENT

- A structured combination of non-intensive outpatient services with a minimum participation requirement of three sessions and eight hours of treatment per week.
- Available to self-pay, court-referred, and Medicaid.
- All Medicaid participants must be Cuyahoga County residents

### CASE MANAGEMENT

- Critical Time Model that addresses basic needs through self-sufficiency
- Available to all program participants
